THE NETTLE DRESS (UK, 2023)

Tues 20th Feb, 2.30 & 7.30pm.

Dir: Dylan Howitt

A poignant and acclaimed documentary in which textile artist Allan Brown spends 7 years coming to terms with his wife's death, by crafting a length of hand-spun cloth from foraged nettles. He describes how the spinning and weaving helped calm his emotions and channel his grief. Finally, he produces a dress that his daughter wears in the nettle woods. A meditative hymn to the healing power of nature and slow craft unfolds as the seasons change and time passes. Cert 12A. 1 hour 8 mins. In English.



CLOSE (Belgium, 2022) **Dir: Lukas Dhont**

Leo and Remi are two 13-year-old best friends, growing up on neighbouring farms in the Belgian countryside, with a seemingly unbreakable bond. When school resumes, the boys' close friendship inspires mean remarks from their classmates; their relationship is put to the test and will never be the same again. An emotional portrait of friendship and love, heartbreak and healing, with fine debut performances from this non-professional young acting pair. Cert 12A. 1 hr 44 mins. Subtitled.

JOYLAND (Pakistan, 2022)

In Lahore, Haider shares a home with his traditional family. Unemployed for two years and pressured to find work, he is set up with a job as a backing dancer at an erotic theatre. With no experience or talent, he joins the troupe of Biba, a trans dancer, and to his confusion, becomes attracted to her. But in the course of time, his and other family secrets come to light. FALLEN LEAVES (Finland, 2023)

In Helsinki, Ansa is single and works in a supermarket on a zero-hours contract. One night, in a karaoke bar, she accidentally meets the equally lonely worker Holappa, an alcoholic. Against all odds and despite misunderstandings, they try to build a relationship, whilst, in the background, Putin's war menaces the Finnish border. LOVE LIFE (Japan, 2022) Dir: Koji Fukada

The story follows Taeko and her husband who live peacefully with her young son Keita until a tragic accident brings the boy's long-lost father, Park, homeless and deaf, back into her life. Elements of mystery and domestic drama are finely blended into a narrative that explores the complexities of relationships and the human capacity for change.
